Kate's role at QMUL includes responsibility for all of the information resources and library spaces at the Mile End, Whitechapel and West Smithfield campuses, as well as other learning spaces such as those at the Hive, Canalside and the new Graduate Centre. She is also responsible for the teams which provide support for researchers on open access publication, teaching for students on information literacy, and archives services for the university.

Kate quickly got down to business by putting into motion the plan to expand 24/7 opening at Mile End Library. Her plans for the future include the installation of a new library services platform, which will make it much more

efficient to purchase and make available all of our information resources, online and in print. Updating more of our study spaces, for example Hive East, to provide a great environment for students, is another of her priorities. She will also be developing a new Library Services strategy, working closely with colleagues across the university.

In her spare time Kate enjoys travelling and loves to be outdoors, spending time in her garden, or going for walks in the countryside.

New resources at QMUL

QMUL now has access to a number of new resources

Find My Past is a digital archive for family history research. It includes the largest online collections of Irish records and UK parish records, and the most comprehensive archive of British military records online.

Human Anatomy Atlas from Visible Body is a 3D anatomy reference tool for healthcare professionals, students and lecturers. As well as the desktop version, a mobile app is available from http://ovid.visiblebody.com/mobile/

LWW Total Access Collection is an expansive collection of all Lippincott Williams & Wilkins (LWW) journals available on Ovid, catering for intensive medical information needs. This prestigious collection includes just about every one of LWW's highly respected titles, from core journals to specialised resources.

Sage Business Cases is a business cases repository, inspiring researchers to develop their own best practices and preparing them for professional success.

SAGE Video - Business & Management is an extensive and diverse collection of over 450 videos. It includes in-depth interviews with experts from across the globe on topics as varied as innovation management, corporate social responsibility and social media marketing.

The Times Digital Archive provides convenient access to a library of back issues of this renowned newspaper online, taking the microfilm collection of The Times (London) and producing a high-resolution digital format with searchable images. The Times Digital Archive enables access to one of the most highly regarded resources for the study of 19th, 20th and early 21st century history. Each January a further year's content is added.

Grants data import project

The Repository and Research Information Team is working on a project with the Joint Research Management Office

(JRMO) and ITS to import a block of grants data into Elements, the research reporting system. The import of this data is expected to make linking outputs and outcomes from research funding easier, and also feed into future developments around statutory reporting (for example, OA compliance reporting to RCUK, and the annual report submission requirements to Researchfish). Planned completion of this piece of work is tentatively set for the end of 2017, but more information will follow in due course. Reading Lists Online

- he library offers Reading Lists Online, a tool for creating, managing and maintaining reading lists and for publishing those lists for students. Some key features we have been developing are:
- Linking Reading Lists Online to QMplus with the Reading Lists Online plugin, so that reading lists can be accessed easily from within QMplus course areas.
- Copyright compliance checking for digitised material. We take your scanned material and make sure that it is copyright compliant before publishing.
- List review service working alongside library acquisitions to make sure that essential and recommended material on reading lists is purchased and made available in the library.

Remember, you can use the Dashboard function to monitor student use of your reading list.
